



## Class Three Newsletter – 25.1.18

This Week...

The children have all been writing their own Paddington adventures this week and I have really enjoyed reading the results. We have been improving our writing by using varied sentence starters and including adjectives, adverbs and subordinate clauses. It is lovely to see the children really developing as writers. In our Maths work we have focused on division and its relationship to fractions. The children have been partitioning in different ways and some have moved onto 'chunking' which is a strategy for solving more complex calculations. Our Science work was all about plants and involved us investigating the male and female parts of a plant. Almost half of us initially believed that there were such things as male plants and female plants so we have thoroughly quashed that misconception through dissecting a lily or a tulip. We studied the water cycle in Geography as part of our understanding of rivers, specifically the Amazon. In our RE we explored the Jewish celebration of Shabbat. We were able to handle artefacts to help our understanding and relate our new knowledge to what we have already found out during this topic.
