

This Week

Our Theme for this half term is the 'This Little Light of Mine'. Our focus in Science this week was to investigate how shadows change. In English, we have continued using the novel 'The Midnight Fox' as the context for our work. We re-wrote a chapter of a novel, then edited and improved our accuracy; we focussed on using fronted adverbials and punctuating them accurately and applied our comprehension skills. In Maths, our focus has honed in on fractions; we have converted between improper fractions and mixed numbers; then added, subtracted and multiplied fractions (some of us even doing so with mixed numbers!). In RE, we explored how Peter accepted his challenge from Jesus to build the church and how, as Christian brothers and sisters, we can live as Christians (in particular, what that looks like in our school family). In History, we have explored what life was like for Saxon people, thinking through how being in different social classes. In Computing, we continued to think about how to stay safe online. In French, we learned how to read, say and recognise colours. In Music, we continued to read music and apply it to what we know to the song 'Dancing in the Street'.


