# This Week in Reception

It has been a great start back to school this week. The children have all enjoyed telling their class friends all about their Easter holidays and they have enjoyed writing about what adventures they have been up to. This week has been all about revising and revisiting the skills that were taught before Easter. Some children have been beginning to think about addition and subtraction sums to 20 and it has been great teaching the children this new skill.

The children have been introduced to our new topic for the term "The Wind in the Willows". The children have all enjoyed writing character descriptions for the Mole in the story. In our science lessons we have been thinking about habitats. The children explored our field and thought about the animals that we might find on there. It was great seeing the children use their imaginations, thinking about imaginary fairies and mythical creatures they have seen.
