This week in Reception

We have been learning all about the Easter story this week in class. At the beginning of the week we learned about how Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. The children enjoyed making palm leaves with Mrs Perry. We also learned about the Last Supper and the children thought about what it must have felt like to be treated unfairly by a friend. The children have also been thinking about how we celebrate Easter by eating eggs and how eggs symbolise the stone in front of the tomb where Jesus was laid to rest. As an extra treat the children have enjoyed making Easter cornflake cakes, yummy!

In our maths lessons we have been creating repeated patterns for our Easter cards. The children enjoyed getting creative (and very messy) making their special cards to send home.

We have also been learning about frogs this week after Isabella in year 1 brought in lots of frog spawn from her Grandad's garden. The children enjoyed thinking about the life cycle of a frog and drew in their learning journals how the frog spawn makes the journey into becoming a frog. We went to the pond with Mr Goodwin to put the frog spawn in and we will keep checking each week to see how they are changing. Spring is finally on its way!
