

# Class 4 Newsletter Autumn Term - 15/09/2017



## This Week

Our Theme for this term is 'The Great Plague'.

We have continued our super start to the new school year. We are remembering that when in school we are here to learn and respect all adults as well as each other. In English, we have explored the genre of Fairy Tales further and have begun to create our own protagonists (in the style of Puss in Boots). There are lots of talking animals vying to be the hero - we just need to make them those heroes. In Maths, our focus has been to extend our knowledge of Place Value, venturing into the realms of decimals. We have worked to apply our knowledge of Place Value through challenges where we can 'show off' our Mathematical prowess. In Science; the Year 4's continued to think why objects either cool down or heat up. We did this through using data-loggers to track the temperature of different beverages. We created a graph to display our findings. We also discussed why a Thermos flask would help this process. The Year 5's (at Ashton Community Science College) used Bunsen burners and other fantastic equipment to separate salt from rock salt. This applied our knowledge of different changes in states as well as being super exciting! The Year 5's also continued in their DT project; this week looking to develop an idea to solve the problem given to us. These products will be available later on in the term... In RE, we thought about people who taught us things that have made an impact on our life and how we live. This led onto a discussion about some stories that Jesus told; something we will explore over the coming weeks. In Geography, we had a great session looking at an atlas in detail, understanding features like the symbols used, and scale, then applying them to retrieve information from an atlas. In PE, we worked on our throwing accuracy - this will set us up for the next step in our progression of Net and Wall games. The Year 5 children also went swimming.
