This Week

Our Theme for this term is 'Water, Water Everywhere!'

This week, due to the fact that Year 6 were completing their SATs, we have made the most of this opportunity to show off our ability in a test situation. These results, as well as work in books will help assess where the children are working and how they are progressing. These tests have included arithmetic and reasoning for Maths, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation as well as Reading. In English, we have written a story, focussing on how we can include as many grammatical features as possible. In the additional Maths lessons, we had some fun completing challenges that applied our maths knowledge in different situations. In **RE**, we discussed the Lord's prayer and although versions may look different; the content is truly the same as taught by Jesus. In Science; we have had a standalone lesson exploring which fidget spinners were the best. We used the constant of a hair dryer and have timed how long they spin for. In my opinion, a better investigation would have been to see how long a fidget spinner took to melt! Alas, no success! In History, we focussed on the leaders (Pharaohs) of Egypt and explored significant ones in a bit more depth. We've had some fun trying to say their names - ask your child to pronounce Hatshepsut. In PE, we have improved our accuracy with throwing in tandem with improving our catching. We also sought to beat our personal best on the running track. In Art, we have been recreating images of water, having a free choice about the media and canvas used. We are still attempting to accurately code the game for playing 'Bat & Ball' and 'Slug trail'. Our Coding skills are being pushed to the limit.
