Extreme English Week

Last week, we had **Extreme English Week** and we were incredibly Extreme! On Monday we created our own crosswords arranging words from our spellings into a puzzle then using dictionaries to help us with the clues. On Tuesday, we applied our **English** and **Maths** skills, creating treasure maps then writing sets of instructions to find the treasure we 'buried'. On Wednesday, we combined **English** and **Science** to create a non-fiction information poster about the teeth in the human body. The children were fully in control of their challenge and increased and decreased the difficulty when appropriate. We also had the privilege of having a **visit** from **local author Barry Durham**. He read the manuscript for a new 'Figaro, the Cat Detective' novel and set us the task of creating the illustrations for his new novel. We also used thesaurus to help us describe different foods and created Word **Art**. We enjoyed a series of round robin activities that included writing the next chapter of a story, learning about Haiku poetry and many other fantastic experiences. We set about on Friday creating the **illustrations** for Barry Durham's novel.

This Week

In **Maths**, we have extended our coordinate knowledge and even translated ourselves (being the coordinates) outside! In **English**, we have written a story about an adventurous chick (linking into our hatching experience) as well as focussing on the necessary grammar for non-fiction writing. In **RE**, we looked at the relationship between Jesus and his disciples and the trust they share. Our **Science** focus was on the digestive system and how each of the parts interact with each other. In **PE**, we enjoyed a taster session on cheerleading with SportsCool Fitness . In **Computing**, we have continued our coding unit using the software Scratch. We are becoming more confident in using the software applying blocks of code to control sprites independently.
