# This Week

In **English**, we have moved on from newspaper writing and have started a new genre based around Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. We have read the first third of the book and watched the beginning of the film to try and get into the mindset of Charlie and how he would be feeling upon receiving the golden ticket. We also have written a character description for a sixth horrible child. In **Maths**, our focus has been fractions. We have understood what fractions are, and have begun to identify equivalent fractions, compare fractions of different sizes and order fractions. This understanding will hopefully set us up well for our work next week. In **Science**; we investigated the bounciness of balls. We tested a variety of balls; all dropped from the same height and will measure the height of their bounce next week. In **RE**, we continued to create an interactive retelling of the nativity using computers. In **DT**, the Year 4s created their own nets for their model of St Paul's Cathedral and the Year 5s designed the 'packaging' for the products we are selling at the Christmas Fayre. In **Music**, we began to dissect a song, understanding how the different parts of the song fit together. We also went to the Pantomime today and had a wonderful time.
