# This Week

Our Theme for this half term is 'A Greek Odyssey'. This meant, in English, we have been able to get our teeth stuck into the genre of 'Myths'. We have looked at three Greek myths to understand the genre and honed in on 'The Twelve Tasks of Heracles'. We have a good understanding of the plot and we are loving getting to grips with the vocabulary. In Maths, we have begun our half term looking at decimal numbers; ordering them, then multiplying and dividing them by 'power of 10' (10, 100 etc.) This will set us up for our measurement work next week, converting between metric units of measure. In Science, in our focus on 'Animals including Humans', we looked at how the human body develops over time. We identified the major changes that occur once a human is born all the way through to old age. In **RE**, the Year 5 children have started a Bible Explorer course with our friend James B. They thoroughly enjoyed exploring the Bible in different ways. The Year 4's began thinking about what trust is, as we seek to reflect on the Easter story as a story of betrayal and trust. In Geography & History, we located the country of Modern Greece and Ancient Greece. We compared the two using a variety of maps and atlases. This is so that, when we explore the Ancient Greek civilization further in History, we have a good grasp of its location in the world. In Art, we concluded our print work of Rousseau's 'Tiger in a Tropical Storm'. In PE, the Year 4 children went swimming.

This half term project lets you explore a feature of the Ancient Greek civilization on your own. You can use websites and library books to help you! **It should ALL be your own work**! (Do not copy and paste!) Each week there is a new task for you to complete (like Heracles) to help spread the project out.

The project should be handed in on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> March. Presentations will take place on 23<sup>rd</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> March.

There will be 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place prizes as well as some projects being marked highly commended. Projects will be judged on effort, presentation, content and consistency.

You can choose your own topic, but here are some suggestions: Gods and goddesses, Ancient Greek wars, The Olympiad, Ancient Greek myths, Ancient Greek architecture, Ancient Greek philosophy

Week One (w/b 20<sup>th</sup> February)

Choose a topic related to the Ancient Greeks. Design a front cover on A4 paper. Remember to include your name, title, some pictures/diagrams and words relating to the topic.

Week Two (w/b 26<sup>th</sup> February)

Create a fact file about your chosen topic on A4 paper. You need to include at least ten facts. Use a variety of presentation features (text boxes, bullet points, did you know? etc.) Remember it must be your own words, not just copied and pasted from your source.

Draw a picture/diagram related to your topic on A4 paper. You will need to include labels and other information.
