Welcome to Lea Endowed

The children have had a great start to school life this week and have all settled into their new roles perfectly. Each day the children have been gaining confidence leaving their parents and entering their new classroom. It has been so lovely seeing them become independent little learners and I am really excited about spending the year getting to know all the children more and teaching them many exciting lessons. This week has been all about getting used to the rules and routines of everyday school life. We have been getting to know each other and have been doing lots of circle time activities to hear our friends talk about their home lives, what pets they have and what they like to do whilst at home. The children have all been given their first reading book this week and they were all super excited to share these with you. This book has no words and the key is to discuss the pictures with your child and ask them questions about the characters. I have included some key questions and prompts in your child's reading bag to help you further with this. Your child will be read with twice a week in school and their book will be changed on these days. Please ensure you sign the reading record to tell us that you have read with your child.

Notices

Please could you ensure that ALL children come to school with a water bottle. Your child should only have water in their bottles and any juice will be thrown away and replaced with fresh water. We also have a "no toys" policy in school so can you make sure children leave their teddies, comforters, dolls etc at home. Later in the term we will begin "Open Door" where parents can come into school to discuss their child's learning. It is also a time where you can look at your child's learning journal, including any work they have done that week.

Welcome Meeting

On **Thursday 22nd September** at **6.00pm**, we will be holding our welcome meeting for all new parents. This meeting will be a chance for you to come into school and find out what your child will be learning this year. We will also be discussing how you can help your child with their phonics and reading.

Next week in Reception

Next week we will be beginning to teach your child the first set of sounds in phonics. This will include s,a,t,p,i. Many children have already learned these sounds whilst at nursery but we will recap these key skills and begin to blend the sounds together to make words. It is important that these sounds are pronounced properly in order for your child to become a confident reader. Our theme for this term is "All about me" and "People who help us". We will be learning about our families and how we are all different and special. We will be looking at people in the community who help us every day and we will be having some very special visitors into school over the next few weeks.
