### \*\*\* ATTENDANCE \*\*\*

As I am sure you are aware, one of the things that OFSTED highlighted during their visit, was that for a certain group of children, attendance at Lea, was low. Although this only related to a very small number of children, in recent weeks, we have seen the



attendance of some children drop to a level that is causing concern. Whilst we of course understand about genuine illness (of which we seem to have had a great deal this term), children's poor attendance does have a negative impact on their learning. The minimum attendance level which is expected at our school is 96%. If a child's attendance falls below 90%, they become a persistent absentee. This means they have missed a significant amount of schooling and their educational progress is at risk.

The Attendance team from Lancashire County Council are working closely with school and we plan to hold attendance panel meetings with parents whose child's attendance has dropped to a level of concern. This will be to look at ways we can work together to improve attendance for those individual children in school.

In order to help raise attendance, we are starting an inter class competition where the class with the best overall attendance for the half term will win a non-uniform day.
