This Week in Reception

This week the children have been continuing to work on the Book "Handa's Surprise". We started the week re-reading the story and sequencing the main parts of the story. The children then made a story map to outline all the key features of the story. Some children then went away and tried to write their own version of the story. In our maths lessons we have been doing lots of weighing. We have been using the weighing scales to see how many cubes it takes to balance different pieces of fruit and vegetables. We have also done some data handling, asking our class what their favourite fruit is. We then looked at our findings and answered some questions for example what fruit is the most/least popular?

In Science this week we had a great lesson tasting fruit and vegetables and trying to guess what they are. The children tried some fruit that they had never had before like pomegranate and courgette. All the children engaged in this really well and tried all the fruit and veg no matter how "Yucky!" We spoke about why we need to eat fruit and veg and thought about what vitamins we get from this food.

Next Week in Reception

In class next week we are going to be looking at non-fiction writing. The children will be designing their own fruit smoothies and we will be writing a set of instructions for the year 1 children to follow. We will be using our weighing and measuring knowledge to measure and make our yummy fruit smoothies. In our afternoons we are going to be thinking about how to stay safe whilst online. The children will be reading a book about a little chick who talks to another chick online but then finds out he's actually a fox. Online Safety is so important to install in to the children from a young age and we will be ensuring the children know the dangers of being online through this lovely, child friendly story.
