This Week

A big 'thank you' to all those children who attended the Sing Together concert last night. The children sang brilliantly and obviously enjoyed themselves. They were a real credit to our school.

Our Theme for this half term is 'A Greek Odyssey'. In English, we have concluded our myth writing topic by composing our own versions of Heracles. Our versions have included some of our grammar foci as well as some of the weird and wonderful beasts we invented last week. In Maths, our focus has been on calculating the area of rectilinear shapes. We have calculated individual areas using known lengths, calculated missing lengths with known area as well as calculating composite area. In Science, our focus was on graph drawing, both bar and line. We have explored the gestation periods of humans as well as the growth of foetuses in the womb. We have also created a graph that we will add to each week as Mrs Smith develops through her pregnancy. In RE, the Year 5 children have continued in their Bible Exploration with James B. The Year 4's mapped out the main events of the Easter story and then empathised with what individuals might have said and thought. In History, we carried out an enquiry into what Greek life was like for children. In PE, we improved our passing and movement skills and thought about how we could apply these skills in a game situation; the Year 4 children went swimming. In Computing, we re-planned our coding to try and ensure our game was within our coding means. In DT, we began to sew our own Greek purses based on our designs.
