This Week...

After the glorious Bank Holiday weekend, we came to school on Tuesday feeling refreshed and set for Summer. Although the weather hasn't continued to shine, Class 3 have had a great week of learning. We continued our work on subordination and subordinate clauses on Tuesday and I feel that the children are beginning to understand the art of creating complex sentences a little better. We used our novel as a stimulus; we have now finished the book and it was like saying goodbye to an old friend! The children have really related to the theme of friendship and have gained new knowledge in terms of character description, enhanced vocabulary and storytelling. I am asking the children to complete a book review for their homework this week - this will go into their English books so it needs to be completed <u>neatly and in pencil</u> please. In our Maths work, we have revisited multiplication in the context of statistics, interpreting pictograms and finding missing numbers in sequences. We have been challenging ourselves to recall our tables in a fast time and have enjoyed trying to beat our previous day's total! The children completed their shadow puppets on Thursday and held their very own puppet show of Charlotte's Web.

As part of our RE unit, Are all churches the same?, we visited Preston City Mission on Friday morning. The children were very good at asking questions to enhance their learning and enjoyed exploring the building. RE at Lea Endowed is based on a questful approach, where children are encouraged to make connections between the Bible and their own lives and seek answers to some of the BIG questions in life. It is lovely to see the children develop in this and move through their journey with a deeper understanding. They are very insightful and have much to teach us adults!
