This Week/Term

We started the term by discussing how we can help each other learn. We reflected on the class rules we wanted and put our **British Values** into practice by democratically choosing the ones we feel will create a positive learning environment. In **Maths**, we have started looking at **place value**; exploring the values of digits once we have "Split up numbers to show their real numbers". In **English** we wrote an account of an event in our holidays. We then took this a step further and edited our work. This will be a particular focus this year as we want to always be improving our work. In **Science**, we started our **Electricity** topic by thinking through how we can be safe using electricity in the home and why it is important to be safe. In **Art & RE**, we have applied our **Maths** knowledge and tried to use tessellation to create a representation of where Christians worship God. We discussed that Christians worship God in a church and in our hearts. We created a Maths themed Art & RE **display** in the corridor outside our classroom to show our discussions. In **Computing**, at the start of the new year, we thought about how we can be safe using the Internet. We created some **e-Safety** posters giving friendly, helpful and sometimes challenging advice.
