In **English** and **RE** this week, we have continued with our genre of play-scripts. We have written a prologue for our Hanukah play inspired by William Shakespeare. We have also written our own scenes and composed stage directions for speech. In **Maths**, our focus has been on statistics through interpreting data from bar charts, line graphs, scatter graphs and more. We have learned new Maths vocabulary such as 'range' and 'average'. The children have been learning their lines as narrators; honing their reactions as actors, and improving their singing ability through the songs within the production.
