This Week

Happy New Year! I hope you've all enjoyed a wonderful (and hopefully relaxing) Christmas holiday.

Our **Theme** for this half term is the **'Amazing Amazon Adventure'**. In **English**, we have started a new genre looking at non-chronological reports. This week we have got to grips with the genre, looking at the features and understanding how you can retrieve information easily. In **Maths**, the start of a term means we have moved onto place value. We have been exploring sequences and negative numbers

(not minus numbers...) This has been brand new learning for some and we have made fantastic progress. In **Science**, we started our unit on 'Living Things in Their Habitats' by exploring the life cycles of three animal classes - mammals, reptiles and amphibians. We discovered that mammals are quite unique in how they give birth to their young. In **RE**, we began our unit on 'Jesus, the Son of God'; being amazing at his power over nature (in commanding a storm to be calm, and by walking on water) and by his power at reversing death in raising Lazarus from his tomb. In **Geography**, before we get down to the nitty-gritty of exploring the Amazon river, we found out as much Locational knowledge as we could about the country of Brazil. Did you know that of the other 12 countries in South America, only 2 of them don't have a border with Brazil?! In **Art**, we looked at the life of Henri Rousseau (our focus artist and inspiration for our work this half term). In **PE**, the Year 4 children began their unit on dance, seeking to travel in particular ways to fit with different characters. The Year 5 children also went **swimming**.

Outstanding Behaviour


We have had a good start to the new year. We all settled down quickly to the school routine and I hope this will continue. The children this week that have modelled outstanding behaviour 3 or more times are:
