

Class 4 Newsletter Autumn Term - 24/11/2017



This Week

In **English**, we have kicked on with the genre of newspaper recounts, looking at many different grammatical features. We have explored verb agreements, past tense, modal verbs and quotes (using speech punctuation). We are becoming more confident when using these features accurately and this will hopefully have a positive impact on their independent writing at the end of the genre. In Maths, we have continued with written methods, this time for division. We have looked at two methods, and are deciding which method works best for us. We will be applying our understanding of this operation next week in 'real world' situations. In Science; we had to tweak the experiment we planned due to complications with how to make the experiment fair (following some research about how to conduct the experiment). We explored the stretchiness of different materials, seeking to find the best costume for Elastigirl - from 'The Incredibles'. In RE, we continued to explore the biblical accounts of Christmas and gave our opinions of different aspects of them. In Topic (a combination of History and Geography), we were introduced to Christopher Wren and discovered his significance with regards to the Great Fire of London. We wrote a Limerick about him, with varying degrees of humour. In PE, we continued to focus on our balance, this time while dismounting from apparatus. We were seeking to control our balance following a pike jump. The Year 5 children also went swimming. In Art, we focussed on creating detail using smaller brushed rather than using large, wide brush strokes.
