## This Week

Our Theme for this term is 'The Great Plague'.

In **English**, we have delved deeper into the genre of fairy tales, creating character descriptions for our antagonists as well as setting the scene for our own stories. Grammatically, we have focussed on noun phrases, fronted adverbials for 'where' and speech. In **Maths**, our focus has shifted from place value to addition and subtraction. We have been quick to start to apply our knowledge in various challenges. It has been good to see children not just 'going through the motions' but thinking about how to tackle the challenges before them. In **Science**; the Year 4s applied their knowledge of temperature in a real-world situation giving advice to a café owner to help keep his hot drinks hot and cold drinks cold. The Year 5s (at ACSC) used Bunsen burners again to separate water from ink this time. We had to monitor our boiling levels so that we didn't try and evaporate ink too! In **RE**, we explored the story of the Unforgiving Servant and represented this through drama and a modern retelling. It is fitting that we have quested through this parable given our weekly theme. In **Geography**, we continued to explore atlases and learned how to read a variety of maps. This will set us up as we begin to look at maps from different time periods.
