

Class 4 Newsletter Autumn Term - 29/09/2017



This Week

Our Theme for this term is 'The Great Plague'.

In **English**, our fairy tale genre work has culminated in us writing our own versions of a fairy tale (based loosely on the novel of Puss in Boots). We have put into practise all the grammatical features we have been practising over the past weeks. In Maths, we have developed our addition and subtraction knowledge through various different challenges and problems. The maths was less difficult (with regards to the numbers we were using) however it tested our knowledge of how to use addition and subtraction. In Science; the Year 4's continued to extend their knowledge of temperature of drinks and planned an investigation on how to keep drinks warm using disposable receptacles. The Year 5's (at ACSC) explored the concepts of reversible and irreversible changes (of course, for some of the experiments we used Bunsen burners). We were able to explain scientifically the experiments we conducted and rather impressed Mrs Ethell. In RE, we continued to explore the teachings of Jesus. The parable we explored was the Parable of the Sower. We explained what we thought the meaning of the parable was, then created a pencil sketch of the parable. In History, we retold 14,000 years of British history in about 4 minutes using simple phrases and actions. In PE, we applied our passing skills in a game situation involving unbalanced teams so we could improve. In Art, we explored Escher's tessellation and recreated our own versions of that, tessellating objects together creating vibrant pieces of Art.
