This Week

Our Theme for this half term is the 'This Little Light of Mine'. Our focus in Science this week was to investigate whether or not bigger torches are brighter; we discovered that it depends on the bulb type, the battery size (therefore how many volts are used), the charge of the battery and the amount of lumens produced by a bulb. In English, we have continued using the novel 'The Midnight Fox' as the context for our work; focussing on applying our comprehension skills. In Maths, we continued with multiplying fractions. We also have carried some 'check ups' to see how our progress measures against that at the beginning of the Spring Term - WE'VE MADE GREAT PROGRESS! In RE, we explored the church and the buildings she meets in. We looked at church gatherings like Spring Harvest, Keswick as well as extraordinary churches; the children also got to create a 'wish-list' for what they would have in their own church building. In History, we have explored what life was like for Saxon people, thinking about being in different social classes, using drama. In Computing, we continued to think about how to stay safe online. In French, we learned how to read, say and recognise colours. In Music, we continued to read music and apply it to what we know to the song 'Dancing in the Street'.

The CHRISTIAN VALUE award for FORGIVENESS goes to Harrison Price for understanding the redemptive power of forgiveness.


The CURRICULUM award goes to Libby Bennett for making super progress with her arithmetic skills.
