Next week in Reception

We are going to be looking at information texts next week focusing on our new chicks. The children will be making booklets all about our new friends. We will also be using the internet to research about spring animals.

In our numeracy lessons, the children are going to be learning odd and even numbers. We will look at patterns in these numbers and be continuing to do some active maths activities.

Next week we will be beginning to teach the children the story of Easter. Please could you speak to your child about Easter and see what their understanding of this is. Lots of children get really confused when learning about the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and it would be really beneficial for you to talk through this at home before we begin our lessons. We teach the story through lots of art based activities and keep it very 'child friendly'. If you have any questions or concerns about this please feel free to speak to me further.

This Week in Reception

Wow, what a busy week we have had in Reception. The children have been making the most of our beautiful weather, doing lots of outdoor learning. We have been doing lots of physical development activities, climbing, running and balancing outside. The children have been working really well together to develop their skills in this area. At the beginning of the week we had a really exciting visitor come into school. Paul, who owns a local farm, brought ten eggs into school for us to look after until they hatch. Finally, after lots of waiting, on Wednesday evening the first chicks began to hatch. We now have eight cute, fluffy chicks being well looked after in Mrs Ramsay's room. To make sure we look after and care for the children properly, the children have been making lists of how to take care of the little chicks.

In our maths lessons, we have been continuing to think of numbers 0-30, which numbers are one less and one more. We have also been doing some active maths, jumping on odd and even numbers in the outdoor classroom.
