### This Week

Our Theme for this half term is the 'This Little Light of Mine'. This links in with our Science, our focus this week being on exploring the concept of light - what it is, how it travels and how it behaves. In English, we have begun a half term focus using the Betsy Byars novel 'The Midnight Fox' as source material. We have focussed on the first three chapters this week, understanding vocabulary in context, using thesauruses to expand our vocabulary, punctuating speech from the novel and empathising with how the protagonists might have been feeling at the opening of the novel. In Maths, our focus has been on decimal numbers; partitioning them; ordering them; counting in them; and rounding them. In RE, our new unit on the Church began with researching what Christian churches look like all around the world; as well as Muslim mosques and Jewish synagogues. In History, due to our focus on the Anglo Saxon occupation of Britain, we used digital maps to locate the country of Denmark, then used atlases to identify Saxon settlements in Britain (we used parts of words to help us identify - "burh or borough" means town!) In PE, we set some personal bests with athletic activities such as running and throwing. Each week, we will strive to beat our best scores and times. The Year 5 applied their passing and moving skills and the Year 4 children went swimming. In Computing, we investigated the legality of using Social Media as primary aged

children.
