This week some very kind members of the PTA spent an entire afternoon helping to sort out the rucksacks and stationery items to go in the rucksacks. After a time-consuming audit it has been established that in order to provide each child in the school with their own rucksack, we are still short of the following items: pencils, 45 rubbers, 105 rulers, 113 sharpeners, 51 pairs of white socks, 70 packs of colouring pencils/crayons, 76 notebooks and 43 rucksacks/bags. We are going to keep running this appeal up until Christmas as we would love to meet our challenging target of 143 completed bags.
