You can choose your own topic, but here are some suggestions: Gods and goddesses, Ancient Greek wars, The Olympiad, Ancient Greek myths, Ancient Greek architecture, Ancient Greek

Week One (w/b 20th February)

Choose a topic related to the Ancient Greeks. Design a front cover on A4 paper. Remember to include your name, title, some pictures/diagrams and words relating to the topic.

Week Two (w/b 26th February)

Create a fact file about your chosen topic on A4 paper. You need to include at least ten. Use a variety of presentation features (text boxes, bullet points, did you know? etc.) Remember it must be your own words, not just copied and pasted from your source.

Draw a picture/diagram related to your topic on A4 paper. You will need to include labels and other information.

Week Three (w/b 5th March)

Imagine you are writing a non-fiction book about your topic. What would the blurb say? Write around 100 words.

Extra Mile: Write a chapter from your book.

Week Four (w/b 12th March)

Write a short speech about your chosen topic (on A4 paper). Include why you chose your topic, and any interesting facts/information you wish to share with the class.

Week Five (w/b 19th March)

Practise your speech at home ready to share with the class in your presentation.
