Wow! What a busy week we have had in Class 3! The children all started the week writing their myths that we have been planning for the last fortnight. They all tried very hard to include fronted adverbials and they are becoming much more competent at using up levelled words. We need a re-focus on basic punctuation – it would be great if, when you are reading at home with your child, you point out where full stops and capital letters are being used and why. In our Science work, the children have been looking at old age and the changes that happen as our bodies and minds get older! We also measured Mrs Smith and added this to our chart in the classroom. In Maths this week we have looked at equivalent fractions and, on Wednesday, the children had a Maths Carousel Morning where they moved through the Key Stage Two classrooms, experiencing treasure hunts, a task on Area and spatial exploration with pentominoes. In our afternoon lessons, we studied the betrayal of Jesus, looking at modern artistic interpretations of this event, and recreating our own versions which are amazing!
