### This Week

In the run up to Easter, we have had some fantastic discussions about Easter and whether Christmas or Easter was most important. In **RE**, we explored the event of Passover and how Jews celebrate and remember the Exodus from Egypt. We sampled food and discussed how Jesus himself is our Passover Lamb. We have been incredibly independent this week in **English**. We have sought to employ various grammatical features to our own versions of the Allan Ahlberg novel 'Woof!' In **Maths**, our focus has been on calculating equivalent units of measure. We have been converting between metric units of measure for length, weight and capacity. In **Science**, we have written a detailed description of the human digestive system - one of the few times we can talk about faeces in class without being told it is inappropriate! In **PE**, having worked on shooting and passing, we focussed on dribbling with a ball. We then applied all these skills through some semi-competitive basketball.
