

# Class 4 Newsletter Autumn Term - 08/09/2017



## This Week

Welcome back!

Our Theme for this term is 'The Great Plague'.

We have had a brilliant start to the new school year. The children have settled back into the school routines well and have adapted to a different style of teacher (for some) and got back into the groove (for others). We have done quite a bit of PSHE this week, talking through the kind of learning environment we want to have and whether to have a fixed mindset or a growth mindset. We discussed the rights we have as learners; the non-negotiable behaviour standards we expect; as well as creating some other rules to help everyone shine in Class 4. The genre in English is fairy tales. We have been exploring the tale of the Pied Piper of Hamelin, reading the text, identifying unknown vocabulary, and hot-seating different characters. We are beginning to understand the flow of the story really well. In Maths, our first focus has been Place Value. This underpins all mathematical learning and so far the children have really sought to excel in this area. In Science; the Year 4s started a unit of the properties of materials and explored the stretchiness of certain materials. The Year 5s started an 8-week, once-a-week visit to Ashton Community Science College for some Science; this week we looked at the organs of the human body (well, sheep organs - but ask your children about it!) In RE, we wrote some very thoughtful and thankful Lunchtime and End-of-the-Day prayers. This will be made available on our Class page on the school website so you can see them. In PE, we practised communicating non-verbally to work as a team. The Year 5 children also went swimming. In Art, we have been recapping the colour wheel, blending different colours - a skill that will set us up for the coming year really well.
