# This Week

In Maths, we extended our knowledge of place value through rounding decimals and multiplying and dividing by powers of 10. This helps in future weeks with units of measure. In English, we have written and edited work on character descriptions and characters' emotions. We are also expanding our bank of super sentences. In Science, in Electricity, we completed a flow diagram showing how electricity moves from its source to our houses. We also started to investigate significant individuals with regards to electricity. In RE, we discussed how the church is different throughout the world as well as the role of the church.
