We have been using actions to try and memorise the main parts of the story. The children have been sent home with a set of actions that I would like them to practise at home. In Maths, we have been learning our numbers through music. The Children have been singing ten fat sausages and ten green bottles. We have had lots of fun performing different versions of these songs.

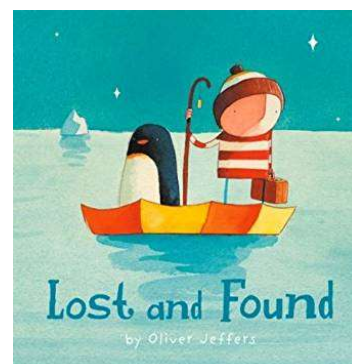

We are going to continue looking at the book "Lost and Found" next week. We will be sequencing the main parts of the story and will be thinking about the characters, setting and plot of the story. In our Maths lessons we are going to be continuing to work on numbers to 20 and will be doing this within our construction area. We are going to be using blocks, straws and unifix to make structures to 20. In our Science lessons we are going to be carrying out an investigation based around the "Frozen" film. We will be thinking of ways that we can melt Elsa's frozen hand using different heat sources.
