This Week

In English, we adapted the original TS Elliot poem, Macavity, describing the fictional character Puss in Boots. We have kept the original structure of Macavity, but have altered all the details. Some of us even went the Extra Mile and attempted to make our description rhyme. Grammatically, we have begun to have a deeper focus on fronted adverbials. In Maths, we have investigated various different elements of Shape and Space. This has involved exploring angles (not angels!), lines of symmetry, parallel and perpendicular lines, culminating in a classification activity, identifying 2D shapes by their properties. In Science; the Year 4s carried out the investigation they planned last week. Unfortunately, it didn't go to plan, but we have many ways to try and ensure it would work in the future. The Year 5s (at ACSC) continued with their focus on microbes and micro-organisms. We explored the results of our swabbing on agar plates. We then experimented with yeast and explored how that micro-organism grows. We also had fun with some 'Cuddly Bugs'. Some of us had Polio, some had Athlete's Foot, and some even had Ebola. In RE, we investigated how Jesus' teaching has impacted on people's lives. We noted how his teaching should impact on how Christian's behave. In Topic (a combination of History and Geography), following our research into London, before and during the Great Fire of London, we have begun to compare how London was different during the Stewart era in comparison to the modern day.
