We are Geographers!


Welcome back after the Easter Holidays. I hope you all had a lovely and peaceful Easter. It was wonderful to see so many of you join us for our Easter Service. The children sang beautifully and the prayers, poems and role plays produced by the children were moving and inspiring.

This week we began our topic "Wind in the Willows" focusing on Geography and Science. We will be looking at maps, weather patterns and reports. Our Science will focus on habitats and animal groups.

In **Mathematics** this week we have been looking at place value through the context of statistics. We have been asking questions using bar charts and pictograms, partitioning numbers in different ways and exploring different ways to represent numbers.

Our **English** work has introduced the story "Wind in the Willows" by Kenneth Grahame. We have been looking at the language of the story and exploring the different characters - particularly Mr Toad, Ratty and Mole.

Our **RE** work this week has involved looking at leaders and their qualities. We will be exploring Saints this half term.

- Reading/English Winter comprehension
- Mathematics Statistics questions (looking at graphs)
- Times Tables Mixed questions practise
- Extra Mile Challenge: Design a home for Ratty or Mole. Label it and explain why it will make a good home.
- Extra Extra Mile Challenge: Research facts about water rats or moles. Habitat, size, behaviours and food.
- Talk Time Talk about or share a favourite story/book from your childhood like "Wind in the Willows".
