Year 6

Year 6 is a challenging year as we get children ready for the transition to high school. We will be promoting an ethos of responsibility and independence and we will be working hard to prepare the children for their end of year tests. We want children to have the very best opportunity to achieve their full potential as well as providing them with long lasting memories of their time at Lea Endowed. My philosophy is very much a partnership between home and school and I would ask you to please support us by ensuring all homework is completed, the children read regularly at home ad that they have good attendance throughout their time in Year 6.

End of year tests

The children will be taking the national curriculum tests (commonly called SATs) in May 2018.

The tests are not qualifications and don't affect your child's future options in school. The results are an opportunity to compare pupils nationally to ensure schools are helping pupils to master the basics in English and mathematics, and make progress.

They are also an important tool to help teachers identify pupils who may need additional support, and make sure this is put in place as early as possible.

The key stage 2 tests will be taken on set dates and the schedule for this is below:

The Year 6 KS2 SATs will be administered in the week commencing 14 May 2018.

The 2018 SATs schedule is as follows:

English reading

Tuesday 15 May 2018

English grammar, punctuation and spelling Paper 1: questions English grammar, punctuation and spelling Paper 2: spelling

Wednesday 16 May 2018

Mathematics Paper 1: arithmetic Mathematics Paper 2: reasoning

Thursday 17 May 2018

Mathematics Paper 3: reasoning

Classroom rules

Multiplication tables – please practise these regularly at home as they have a huge impact on Maths work we do in school.

A piece of English and a piece of Maths work will be sent home each Wednesday – to be returned to school the following Monday.

Projects – the children will also receive a half termly project to complete at home. This will give them weekly set tasks and will be handed in all together once all tasks have been done. This may include a presentation to the class. These projects are wonderful tool for helping the children develop their organisation skills which will be needed next year when they are in year 7!

Please ensure your child's name is in all P.E. kits and uniform. P.E. lessons will be on a Monday and swimming will be on a Friday afternoon.
