## Next week in Reception

Next week we are going to be thinking more about the Easter story. It was really interesting this week talking about why we celebrate Easter. Many of the children were unsure of the meaning of some of the symbols of Easter, for example the egg. We spoke about this being the sign of the stone that was placed in front of the tomb. The children have enjoyed having their own bibles and exploring other stories from the New and Old Testaments. It is great to see them really thinking about Christianity. The children are so mature when answering and asking questions and are all becoming such independent learners. We will continue to learn more about the Easter story. We will be sequencing key events as well as making lots of lovely Easter art.

We are also going to begin a diary for the tadpoles, taking pictures and writing about how they are growing and changing.

## This Week in Reception
