This week our focus in English has been poetry. We have been studying a poem by Ann Perrin called 'The Old Dry Stone Wall' and looking at the structure and language choices. We have really enjoyed performing the poem using intonation and discussed how punctuation helps us to pause in the right places to create an effect. Following this, we have also written a class poem to perform during our Easter Service. The children have a mature understanding of the key events of Holy Week and Easter and this has been an excellent way of helping to express this knowledge in a creative way.

In our maths work this week we have been looking at lines and angles and naming obtuse, acute and right angles correctly. We took our learning outside to find parallel and perpendicular lines in the school grounds. Some children began to explore using protractors to order and measure angles. This proved quite a challenge and so we have spent extra time on this to secure our understanding.
