Welcome back after half term! I cannot believe that we are more than half way through the academic year already. Time flies! We have been applying all our writing skills that we have been learning over the last few months and also learning how to make singular nouns ending in 'y', plural. I am also encouraging all children to 'have a go' with their joined up handwriting. Some of the children are resisting this but, as we say, practise makes perfect! We have been looking at properties of 2D shape in our Maths and identifying right angles, acute and obtuse angles around school. The children are becoming more proficient at using mathematical vocabulary. Our new Science unit is Animals including Humans and this half term we are looking at growth and development from baby to old age. Mrs Smith came in to talk to the children about her pregnancy and has agreed to let us chart her baby's growth each week by measuring her 'bump'! In preparation for Easter, we have started exploring trust and betrayal in our RE work.
