This week in **English**, we have started a new unit on instruction and explanation writing. We have explored all the features and started to write our own instructions for everyday activities using the correct punctuation. In **Maths**, we started thinking about factors and square numbers before beginning our 10 week check-up tests. In **Science**, we created simple circuits that lit up bulbs, made buzzers sound, and moved motors. In **RE**, we created pieces of artwork based on what the Bible says about itself. In **PE**, we started our unit of dance linking in with **Music**. We used the 'BBC 10 Pieces' as inspiration, in particular the Anna Meredith piece called 'Connect It' that uses the body to create music. We continued with regular practise for Sing Together.
