### Harvest Collection 2016

For Harvest this year we have chosen to share some of what we have with our school family in The Gambia. We are aiming to send out a rucksack or school bag for each of the children in the "New Life" school. We hope to collect the rucksacks themselves, and aim to put a set of stationery items such as a ruler, pen, pencil, felt pens, crayons and a notepad inside each one. We are asking for donations in whatever form you feel able to support. You can donate as little or as much as you can afford. You may choose to send in a small donation of a packet of crayons **Or** a rucksack containing a full set of equipment - **all donations will be most welcome**, (charity shops often sell children's rucksacks that are in good, clean condition- these would be very much appreciated too) Please feel free to begin collecting and send in your donations anytime from the first week in October. Once we have made up enough rucksacks for each child, the children will write letters to our "brother and sister pupils" in The Gambia School and add them to each of the bags. There are 143 children in their school – ranging from 3 to 14 year olds. I have also had a special request for children's white socks (clean good condition second hand will be appreciated as well as new).
