This Week

Our Theme for this term is 'Water, Water Everywhere!'

We've started a new **English** unit of "Story with a Theme". Our story is 'The Mousehole Cat' by Antonio Barber. We have been getting underneath the skin of this novel and have been exploring the two main characters (Tom and Mowzel). We have been trying to utilise noun phrases and are seeking to be precise in our use of them. In **Maths**, time has been our focus. We have used analogue, digital, and other greater units of time. In **RE**, we have represented the Lord's Prayer using art. In **Science**;

we have started to deepen our understanding of states of matter and we have focussed on temperatures. In **History**, we focussed on the leaders (Pharaohs) of Egypt and explored significant ones in more depth. In **PE**, we prepared ourselves for the Craig McCann circuit sessions next Monday. In **Art**, we are still recreating images of water, having a free choice about the media and canvas used. Our Coding skills are being refined week on week as we seek to create the games 'Bat and Ball' as well as a 'Slug Trail' game.
