CHRISTMAS ONLINE SAFETY TIPS

Before Gifting Technology

- Unbox and set up devices first Install updates, enable parental controls, and check privacy settings.
- Create strong passwords
 Use unique passwords and enable two-factor authentication where possible.
- Check app permissions
 Disable unnecessary location sharing and data access.

On Christmas Day

- Agree on family rules
 - Set screen-time limits and device-free zones (e.g., mealtimes).
- **Talk about online safety**Explain why privacy matters and encourage children to come to you if something feels wrong.
- Enable safe search and filters
 Activate age-appropriate content filters on browsers and apps.

Ongoing

- Monitor and review
 - Regularly check settings, app updates, and online activity.
- Stay engaged
 - Play games together, explore apps, and keep conversations open.
- - Teach children to avoid clicking suspicious links or sharing personal info.
