This half term, our focus in our Monday whole school worships is **Courageous Advocacy** or **Game Changers**. Together we are finding out about amazing people who have changed the world for the better because of their Christian faith. So far this term we have heard about Geoffrey Studdart Kennedy, Pastor Wang Yi and Edith Picton-Turbervill (some great names aren't they!) These incredible men and women inspire us to live bravely and follow the example of Jesus. Their lives remind us that God calls us to stand up for justice, care for the vulnerable, and shine His love in the world. By learning their stories, we discover how we too can be bold disciples who make a positive difference, where we live and beyond.

This week the children have enjoyed taking part in a range of activities for National Storytelling week such as, the Year 1 children wrote their own stories and read them to the Reception children in their story corner and Classes 3 and 4, joined a live link RAP (Rhythm & Poetry). Reading stories, and being read to, opens children's imagination, strengthens their language skills, and helps them make sense of the world. Sharing a few minutes with a book each day can shape your child's confidence and nurture a lifelong love of reading.
