Class News

I must start this week's news by saying a huge thank you to every family member or friend that donated to our Bog-Eyed Jog fund raiser last Tuesday. The Year 6 children had an extended session on the track, first chaperoning their Reception buddies through their laps and then continuing on alone, collecting stickers every time they passed go. We will let you know the grand total as soon as all the sponsor money is sent in.

In the last two weeks we have spent more time focusing on using our reasoning skills in Maths to unpick and find the right steps to answer multi-step problems. Together we have explored different ways of doing this to help the children find a strategy that works best for them. In addition to this, we have learnt how to accurately read a protractor to measure and draw angles. In English we have revisited speech punctuation and techniques to build tension, both skills that the children have used this week to write a suspense scene for when the Endurance lurched onto its side in Antarctica. Reading is still a top priority so do please encourage your child to read for at least 15 minutes every day.

Our Science learning has been research based this term as we are learning about the contributions various famous scientists have made to the world. This week we have learnt about the work of Alexander Fleming whose discovery of penicillin has saved millions of lives.

In RE we have continued to explore who Jesus was and who he said he was – thinking that will help the children greatly as we prepare for Easter and our Easter Worship.
