#### This Week...

This week we have continued reading and discussing a range of poetry relating to our Water topic. We have also had the opportunity to work on writing our own poems. In Maths we have looked at data handling and bar charts. The children enjoyed taking maths outside to collect their data! In Geography, the children have looked at the different features of a river as well as continuing their research of world rivers in Computing. This week's R.E. lesson continued our study of the Lord's Prayer in greater depth, focussing on how God provides for us every day. In Art, we have continued to explore the works of Monet, Turner and Wilmslow Homer using different mediums! PE has surrounded a focus on ball skills within cricket. French lessons have concentrated on learning and recognising numbers.
