The children have continued to enjoy our class novel, which we are using to inspire our Writing as well as a valuable Guided Reading resource. Our work on fractions has continued with the class looking at adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators followed by applying this knowledge to problem solving. We have started exploring the circulatory system in our Science and finding out about the journey of the red blood cell as it delivers oxygen and collects carbon dioxide on its journey to every cell in the body. In our RE this week, we investigated the question, 'Who was Jesus?' and used passages from scripture to support our opinions. 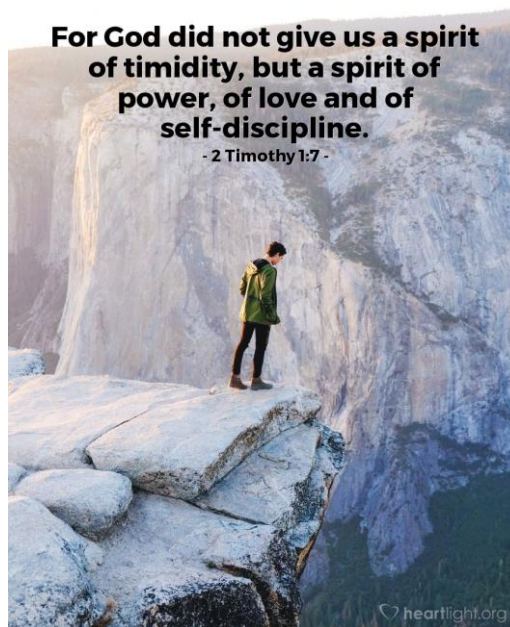
