BIBLE READING - John 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.


There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, 'This was he of whom I said, "He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me." ') From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

The Maker's Instructions



I have never been that good at cooking – my wife would readily agree with this. When the kids were younger and still at home, they all knew that if Dad was cooking, then whatever it was would be well and truly "crispy" come serving time.

Which is one reason why I have always loved microwave meals! Just a quick whizz through the instructions (why do they make the print so small?), pierce

the film, in it goes, and ping! A few minutes later all done! Yes, the tricky ones need stirring halfway through and maybe some water adding as well but even I can manage that.

One thing that has always struck me though, is that the instructions often have a clause towards the end stating that you may need to put it in for longer or shorter than the stated time. And yet, I have never needed to do that. So long as I have followed the instructions properly like it says, it is always piping hot, always.

Our reading today is God our Father's instructions – telling us on the side of the packet – what He was doing when he sent his Son the Lord Jesus into our world.

And then John goes onto say later on (v14):-

"And the word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory"



The instructions are clear, this is not a light that is still some way off in the distance, at the far end of the tunnel. This light is a person, this light is Christ, and this light is already here with us.

John adds that he and others have had that deep experience of Jesus being amongst them, "...we have seen his glory...". John has found that all those instructions from the Father about Jesus have proved true in practice, in his own life too.

And to have that radiant trust in Another's care for us at the core of our being is worth its weight in gold – here, now, today. And with Christ in us, we carry that certainty of hope with us always, wherever we go, always.

And how will that show? It will show in the 1001 ways in which we help all those in need around us. By the help we give to our neighbours, our family, our friends, our work colleagues, basically anyone and everyone we come across. Whatever the need is, whatever shape or form that help takes. Many are doing such wonderful stuff already for others, and the simple prayer, "Lord show me who I can help and where I can help today?" will always be answered. And even with quite little things, people often still remember many years later down the line the kindness that was shown to them at the time.
