





LEARNING IN SCHOOL

English: We have completed a really short unit on fables. We have explored and re-written the fables of 'The Hare and the Tortoise' and 'The Boy Who Cried Wolf'. We then wrote out own fables about zebras, leopards and elephants.

Maths: We have explored negative numbers, with a particular focus in the context of temperature and we have explored Roman Numerals.

RE: Our unit thinking about Jesus being a teacher started with us thinking about teachers in our lives. Not just teachers like Mr Bateman but anyone who has taught things. We had examples of parents teaching children to ride a bike, coaches at trainings and many more.

Science: We began our unit exploring the human digestive system. We had lots of fun creating different models using bin-bags. Geography: We began our unit learning and exploring the European country of France. We used atlases to identify the significant geographical features such as the capital city, bordering countries, rivers, mountain rangers, major cities and more.
