Following on from our work on St George's Day, this week we have been writing about George and the Dragon. We have looked at some *very* tricky letters and sounds – *ow, oi, ear* and *ur*. We have been looking at numbers to 40, and copying 3D models made from cubes. In RE we found out what happened to Joseph when he arrived in Egypt, and talked about how he felt at different points in the story.

Next week...

In Maths we will be counting on from different numbers and thinking about first, second, third etc. Our Literacy will be based on the story of 'Oliver's Vegetables'. Our RE work will take us to the point in the story where Joseph is in jail. We will look at the biggest plants we have around us – the trees. We will explore textures by making bark rubbings.
