



Roadworks - Flood Alleviation Project

This week, you will have received a letter concerning the upcoming roadworks, to improve the sewer network, distributed by the contractors Bethell, who are working on behalf of United Utilities. Since then, I have been in further communication with both United Utilities and the customer liaison manager at Bethell who has confirmed that,

"During the closure on Sidgreaves Lane, the access to Lea Endowed School will be via Avice Pimblett Way for vehicles, pedestrian access will be available."

"There will be no work or disruption outside the school. Once Hoyles
Lane is completed, the sewer upgrade moves through the land
opposite school (Quaker Lodge). That will be towards the end of 2024."
