This Week

We have had a good start back this term. I hope you all have enjoyed the Christmas break. This term we have knuckled down straight away and in Maths we have been focussing on the place value of decimals. In English, we are studying another newspaper unit but our focus is on earthquakes and volcanoes. This is also our Geography unit; this week we located the country of Japan (a hotbed for such activity). In RE, we explored how people teach us and why certain teaching lasts a lifetime. In DT, we planned our designs to create our model volcanoes. In Science, we explored the human digestive system. This has set up our unit looking at Animals and Humans. In PE, we focussed on accurate throwing into a target, varying our methods for throwing to be as successful as possible. In Computing, we began our unit looking at spreadsheets.
