



KS1 'We're all going on a Summer Holiday' Home Learning Project - Summer Term (2nd Half) 2020



This half term our planned topic is 'We're all going on a Summer Holiday'. Our class work would normally be focused on Blackpool today and how it has changed since Victorian times. We would also be exploring coastal features and weather in our Geography lessons.

Your child's task over the next 4 weeks will be a seaside research project. This could focus on a particular seaside resort, the history of a seaside resort, features of a seaside/coastal location or could focus on one element such as rock making at Blackpool.

Aim: For your child to gather information, on a seaside topic of their choice, which they can present to our class members, other pupils at a later date, or via video clip.

They could:

- Make a model of the place or a landmark. Eg. Blackpool Tower or Lytham Windmill
- Write a set of instructions for making their model.
- Create an information booklet about your chosen resort. Eg. Filey, Scarborough
- Create a fact file with pictures, information and captions.
How has the resort changed, developed or grown, over the past 100 years?
- Research the coastal features for the resort they have chosen.
- Design and write a postcard telling others about things you can do there.
- Draw, paint or collage a picture.
- Design and make a new ice-cream or lolly, and write a recipe for it to share with the class.
- Investigate where the best and worst places are to keep ice-lollies.
- Do a survey with friends and family about their favourite ice-cream flavours or lollies and record their findings on a chart or pictogram.
- Make a model sandcastle - or a real one! (if you have a sandpit)
- Create a poster/advert to encourage people to visit.
- Design and make a sun hat or sun parasol for a favourite teddy/toy.
- Investigating which materials are the best for making a sun shade or hat. (What properties do the materials need to have?)
- Learn a seaside shanty or holiday song. Some examples are:

- Write a speech, poem or your own holiday song.
- Make a Punch and Judy show puppet and perform a puppet show.
- Design a new ride for the Pleasure Beach.
The budding engineers amongst you could even build a working model!
(Construction toys allowed)



Or anything else, which inspires your child to learn as much as they can about their chosen topic.

In order to gather information you could:

- Make an online visit to the library.
- Look at books you already own.
- Talk to a family member or someone who knows about the seaside resort chosen.
- Research information on the internet (supervised).

For example, the type of information we hope you might share for Blackpool is:

- How did Blackpool get its name?
- What landmarks does Blackpool have?
- When were they built?
- How many piers does Blackpool have? When were they built? What happened to them?
- What travel system is used?
- What is Blackpool famous for?
- What was Victorian Blackpool like? What did people wear to the beach? What did they do for fun?
- How has Blackpool changed over the last 100 years?



Projects are due in by Monday 13th July.

All children will receive a reward for completing their project and there will be special prizes for the best 5 projects in each year group.
